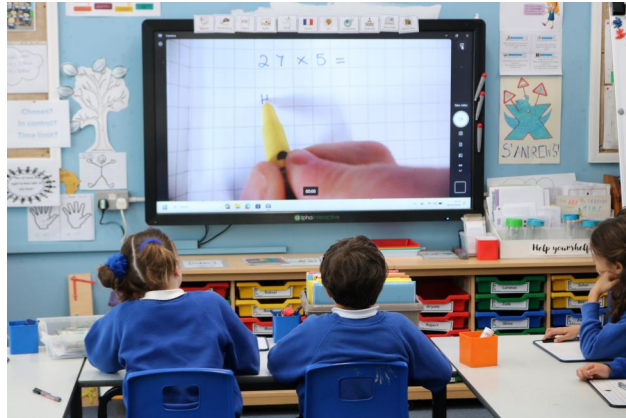

All the food collected will be donated to our local food bank.

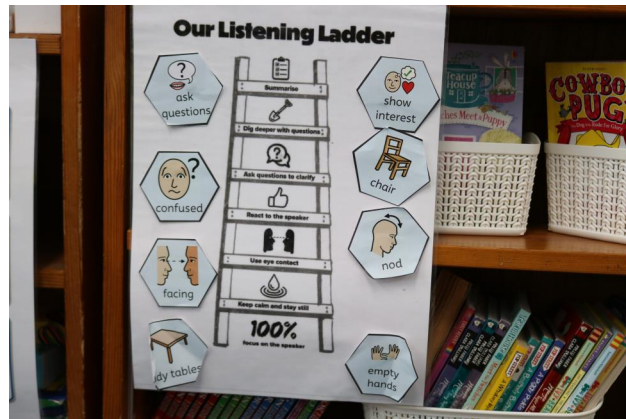

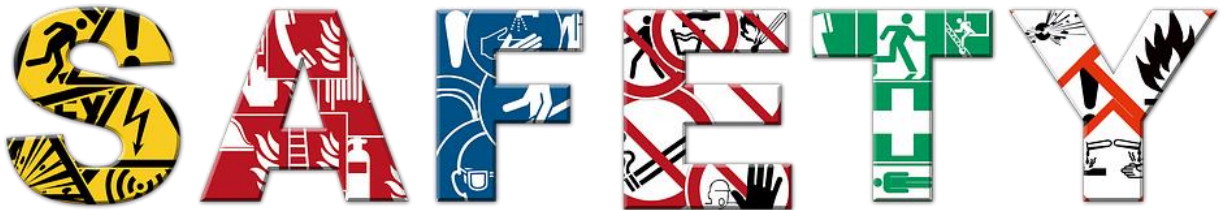


Coffee mornings
