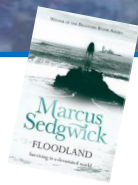


English

RE

In RE our big question is "Can we know what God is Like?". We will explore different views of God and how some people believe they can know God or know about God while others do not believe at all. This unit brings together everything we have learned about God, sacred text, symbolism and revelation. It gives pupils an opportunity to explore a range of different ways that people express their beliefs and seek to find answers to some of the big questions of life.



PE

The focus for this term will be Athletics. The children will be learning and enhancing their skills at sprinting, relay, long-jump, triple-jump, and javelin. The children will get the opportunity to share their skills at the Key Stage 2 Sports Day.

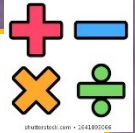
During indoor PE lessons, the children will develop and apply their sending and receiving ball skills through a range of traditional and non-traditional games.

The last two weeks of term will be our whole school Health Weeks. We will participate in a range of activities including skateboarding and yoga.



Maths

In our Maths lessons we will engage in a range of activities linked to a project titled 'Futures'. We will complete tasks and activities to develop our understanding of wages, hourly rates, bills, mortgages, etc. We will continue with our Early Work—completing questions in our Mental Arithmetic books—this helps develop our fluency and use of mental maths strategies.



Art and Design

We will create collages of parts of animals (linked to our Biomes topic from last term). We will be inspired by the works of Pablo Picasso, Megan Coyle, Henri Matisse, and many more wonderful artists.

Science

In Science we will be studying electricity. We will use different components in simple circuits to see what effects they have and investigate what happens if we change the circuit. We will learn to use scientific symbols and diagrams and we will use our knowledge to design and make a product.

Computing

The unit begins with a simple program for pupils to build and test their ideas. They will then transfer this work to their micro:bit. Pupils will then take on three new projects which in turn add more depth of understanding.
